While enrolled in the Residential Program, women and children attend group and individual support sessions, team up with case managers to develop individual and family goals, receive health screenings and education, legal advocacy, financial literacy workshops, transportation assistance, job placement guidance, assistance in securing new safe housing, and a wide variety of community referrals and linkages to social service resources. Meals and personal hygiene items are also provided free of charge. In addition to the residential program, The Women's Safe House has a crisis intervention line, youth development program, community education program, and an aftercare program.

Description: A Transitional Housing Program for Families Only. Homeless families residing in emergency shelters or similar facilities for a minimum of 30 days must be referred by the social service agency assisting the family in this first step of the continuum of services.

They accept homeless families with an adult head of household and dependent children aged 17 or younger. An adult head of household is any male, female, or married couple with legal guardianship of children in the family. Families must participate in structured programs and services designed to help them achieve self-sufficiency. Families must contribute 30% of their adjusted gross income for rent during residency. Constructed in 2000, The Family Living Center has fourteen apartments, a common room, computer lab, and laundry room.

You'll find help with: Extended shelter through this transitional housing program. The Family Living Center provides comprehensive case management services for each family. A Family Development plan is created with input from family members. These plans guide professional staff in their work with each family. Families receive food vouchers when they enter the program. Residents purchase and prepare their own meals. Transportation and childcare subsidies may be provided if family and/or community resources are insufficient to meet these needs. Families who successfully complete the program can receive resource assistance for 6 months after leaving the center. The Family Living Center offers on-going training activities that meet the needs of each family member. Other core activities offered through the Center include-- Life Skills Training, Parenting, Education/Vocation Resources, Finance and Budgeting Classes, Legal Aid Assistance, Housing Assistance, and On-Site Youth and Adult Computer Classes. Housing and supportive services are provided for 18 months and can be extended for up to 24 months depending upon consumer's progress in the Program.

Description: Services at Comprehensive Behavioral Health Center of St. Clair County, Inc. are consumer driven, provided in a respectful and ethical fashion, regardless of the ability to pay and discounts are available based on family size and income. Their services are designed to meet the needs of children, adolescents and adults. Services may include but are not limited to therapeutic counseling, psycho-social testing, individual and group therapy, crisis intervention, consultation, community intervention, psychiatric evaluation, case management services, referrals, and outreach services. Emergency and Crisis Intervention services are offered 24-hours a day, seven (7) days per week. Professional staff provide walk-in, outreach and telephone intervention to persons of all ages who may be in crisis. Clients experiencing acute distress requiring protective care will be referred to the local hospitals or the Alton Mental Health Center.

You'll find help with: They have a Drop-In Center. Those who are homeless or in need can visit the Drop-In Center from 10 AM-4 PM Monday-Friday. They will be able to take advantage of a free meal, a change of clothes, and laundry services. Comprehensive Behavioral Health Center Services include—Therapy & Transitional Services, Parenting Classes, Linkage & Hospitalization Aftercare, Residential Services, Specialized Children Services, Consultation/Education to Community, Crisis Intervention, Substance Abuse Treatment Services, Project for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH), Case Management Services, Opiate Treatment Services, and Adult Re-Deploy. It is important to note that no one will be denied access to services due to inability to pay, and there is a discounted/sliding fee schedule available based on family size and income.

Our Transitional Housing program provides families up to two years of safe, affordable living while they work toward stability, education, and permanent housing. Located steps from our Maternity Center, Transitional Housing offers community support in a home-like setting where families continue to grow. Our commitment extends beyond immediate needs, offering sustained support to help families maintain housing stability and prevent a return to being unhoused. The Haven of Grace fosters emotional resilience through family-style encouragement and relationship-building, while also providing access to crucial resources for educational advancement, workforce participation, and financial growth.
